**MEASURES DUE TO LOCKDOWN RELEVANT TO VISITORS AND TRAVELLERS**

16 April 2021

Due to the increasing cases of variants of the COVID-19 virus, the government of Curaçao announced an extension of the lockdown for another two (2) weeks effective 16 April 2021. We would like to provide you with valuable information relevant to tourists and travelers.

The airport will remain open for business, however all passengers who arrive in Curaçao are also subject to the announced measures:

1. Visitors will have to stay in principle at home/in hotel with limited exceptions as described below.
2. There is a daily Curfew from 19:00 LT to 04:30 LT
3. Vehicle Number Plate of the day. Vehicles (including rental cars) with the following first letters on the number plate will be allowed on the streets only on the indicated days, as follows:
  4. A, D, F, G, H, K, BF, Z, WA or SpKen - Mondays and Thursdays only
  - B, J, L, N, R, U or MF - Tuesdays and Fridays only
  - S, T, V, X or Y - Wednesdays and Saturdays onlyNo vehicles will be allowed on the road on Sunday's, Vehicle free.
5. The following vital businesses will be allowed to remain open: Supermarket, Minimarket, Pharmacy, Bakery, Hardware Stores, Gas Stations, Bank Institutions for money transfer, Medical Laboratories.
6. Restaurants delivery service only between 12pm noon and 6pm LT.
7. Sports are only allowed on an individual basis in the vicinity of your home or hotel between 04:30am and 08:00am and 04:30pm and 07:00pm LT on foot or on bicycle. Close family members of the same household may do this together.
8. All beaches will be closed.
9. The airport will remain open for business however all visitors will be subject to all announced measures.
10. Visitors with a vehicle will be subject to the restrictions of their number plates allowing access to the streets only on the indicated days in point number 3 and only for essentials. No excursions and driving around for pleasure is allowed.

Visitors with a rental car or other vehicles having to pick up or bring visitors from or to the airport can do so on all days, including Sundays, as long as they have a copy of the ticket with them. Public transport and taxis are always available.

These measures will remain in effect until the lockdown is lifted. All visitors shall also comply with the general rules as announced by the Ministry of Health of the government of Curaçao, i.e., General Mandatory Hygiene (washing of hands), Social Distancing (6ft.) and wearing of a face mask.
