 Temporary Instructions for entry requirements for fully Vaccinated residents of Curaçao, Aruba and Bonaire.

Dear Sir/Madam,

While the Ministerial Decree and the CCAA Directive are being finalized, it is desirable to provide further instructions in the mean time with regard to the entry policy for fully vaccinated residents of Curaçao, Aruba and Bonaire. As of immediately, the following instructions apply until the updated directive is published:

Fully vaccinated means:

1. Two (2) vaccination stickers or badge number plus initials in the vaccination booklet of the government of Curaçao, Aruba or Bonaire. The second vaccination being taken at least 2 weeks before travel; or
2. One (1) vaccination sticker or badge number plus initials and the message "fully vaccinated due to a recently confirmed COVID-19 infection" in the vaccination booklet of the Government of Curaçao.

See attached examples of vaccination booklets or certificates from the island governments.

In principle fully vaccinated residents of Curaçao, Aruba or Bonaire can enter Curaçao without taking any tests, however if the passenger has remained in a third country and/or has visited a third country in the last 14 days prior to travel to Curaçao, the risk category of that country applies.

All passengers are required to complete the required PLC form online at: <https://dicardcuracao.com/portal>. Both a digital or printed copy of the PLC and PCR test are now accepted at immigration upon arrival.

A PCR test is to be taken no earlier than 72 hours before flight. An Antigen test is to be taken no earlier than 24 hours before flight. By presenting the Vaccination booklet/certificate from the governments of Curaçao, Aruba or Bonaire, no further proof of residency is required.
