Dear Sir/Madam,

We hereby would like to inform you that the Government of Curaçao has decided, as per Ministerial Regulation P.B. 2021 No. 121, dated 19 November 2021 to amend the restrictions for entry into Curaçao until further notice. These measures have been taken to contain the spread of the COVID-19 virus in Curaçao. This directive supersedes the previously issued directive CURCW/20/138-30 dated 6 December 2021.

**Air Travel to Curaçao from all countries is allowed under the following conditions.**

- 1) A. Passengers travelling from **VERY LOW-RISK** countries & territories as listed in **Appendix A**, effective **25 December 2021**, (<https://gobiernu.cw/corona-travel-to-curacao/>) are allowed entry under the following conditions:
  - A Public Health Passenger Locator Card (PLC) and, for non-residents, the Immigration ED, Embarkation–Disembarkation, Card need to be completed online at: <https://dicardcuracao.com/portal>, **no earlier than 48 hours before the flight**.
  - The passenger shall have a digital or print copy of the PLC form and the Immigration ED Card (the latter not applicable for residents), as received per mail from the aforementioned portal available for Immigration or another indicated government agency upon arrival in Curaçao.
  - Passengers who travel from a **Very Low-Risk** country via a **Very High-Risk** country and transit or transfer within 24 hours to Curaçao **are exempted** from the requirements for Very High-Risk countries.
  - Passengers who travel from a **Very Low-Risk** country via a **Very High-Risk** country within 14 days to Curaçao **must comply with** the requirements for Very High-Risk countries.
- B. Passengers travelling from **VERY HIGH-RISK** countries & territories as listed in **Appendix A**, effective **25 December 2021**, (<https://gobiernu.cw/corona-travel-to-curacao/>) are allowed entry under the following conditions:
  - A Public Health Passenger Locator Card (PLC) and, for non-residents, the Immigration ED, Embarkation–Disembarkation, Card need to be completed online at: <https://dicardcuracao.com/portal>, **no earlier than 48 hours before the flight**. The passenger shall have a digital or printed copy of the completed PLC form and the Immigration ED

Card (the latter not applicable for residents) available for Immigration upon arrival in Curaçao, as received per email from the portal.

- A **COVID-19 PCR test no earlier than 48 hours** prior to the scheduled departure date. The result of the passengers' PCR test with negative results must be uploaded online at: <https://dicardcuracao.com/portal>. The passenger shall have a digital or print copy of the PCR test results available for Immigration upon arrival in Curaçao.

**Exempted from the PCR test are:**

- a. Minors **below twelve (12) years** of age who do not show COVID-19 symptoms;
- b. Active crew members;
- c. Passengers who depart-arrive/arrive-depart on the same day;
- An **Antigen test must be taken on the third day after arrival** in Curaçao, as booked and paid for when completing the PLC form online at <https://dicardcuracao.com/portal> **no earlier than 48 hours** before the flight. An appointment can be made online at any of the available laboratories.

**Exempted from the Antigen test on the third day after arrival are:**

- a. Passengers who depart Curaçao within three (3) days after arrival.
  - b. Transit/Transfer passengers who continue their journey or return on the same day.
  - c. Minors **below twelve (12) years of age** who do not show symptoms of COVID-19.
  - d. Personnel entering Curaçao for the military US FOL.
  - e. Persons who contracted the COVID-19 virus in the recent past and who can present: A negative Antigen test result taken no earlier than 24 hours prior to departure; and the result of a PCR positive test taken within the previous 3 months and a second PCR positive test taken no earlier than 48 hours before departure.
  - Persons travelling from a Very High-Risk country who have been infected with the COVID-19 virus in the recent past and for whom the PCR test result is positive may travel to Curaçao, as long as they can present before departure:
    - a. A negative Antigen test result taken no earlier than 24 hours prior to departure;
    - b. The result of a PCR positive test taken within the previous 3 months and a second PCR positive test taken no earlier than 48 hours before departure.
  - To be allowed to board the flight, the passenger must show the completed PLC Form and the PCR or Antigen test, must indicate a Negative result. If the DCC QR code is used, this will be scanned and should show a green check mark.
  - If the time limits of 48 hours or 24 hours have been exceeded due to unforeseen circumstances, a new test shall be taken immediately upon arrival in Curaçao at the cost of the passenger/traveler. The passenger shall remain in quarantine pending the result of the test. A testing facility is available at the airport.
- 2) All Passengers must have a mandatory valid medical insurance to cover any eventual COVID-19 related incurred costs, including transportation and quarantine costs for the duration of the stay.

**Exempted from the mandatory medical insurance coverage are:**

- a. Residents of Curaçao;
- b. Active Flight Crew Members;
- c. Passengers who depart Curaçao within 24 hours of Arrival;
- d. Holders of a Diplomatic Passport;


- e. Members from the Armed Forces of the Kingdom of the Netherlands and direct family members;
  - f. Transit/Transfer passengers who continue their journey without entering Curaçao.
- 3) **There are no restrictions for passengers departing Curaçao.** Passengers shall adhere to the requirements of the Airport Authority and shall comply with the entry requirements of their destination.
  - 4) The aircraft shall be handled according to standard operating procedures to ensure and continue safe and normal operations.
  - 5) **Active Flight crew members** shall be allowed to continue their duties while complying with the sanitary rules applied by the Government of Curaçao, to include but not limited to, hygiene requirements, wearing a face mask before disembarking and social distancing. Active flight crew members are exempted from COVID-19 test requirements, completing the Public Health Passenger Locator Card (PLC) and the Immigration ED Card. Until further notice, Flight Crew Members who overnight in Curaçao are required to remain in the vicinity of the hotel.
  - 6) **Transit/Transfer** passengers who continue their flight within twenty-four (24) hours of arrival are **exempted** from completing the PLC Form, the PCR and Antigen test requirements. They should comply with all entry requirements of their destination.
  - 7) Passengers who arrive in Curaçao or during their stay on the island shall adhere to the local medical protocols to include hygiene requirements, wearing a facemask and social distancing.
  - 8) Passengers who arrive in Curaçao or during their stay on the island who have been determined to be infected with the COVID-19 virus are obliged to immediately go into a **ten (10) day** mandatory quarantine or isolation, including taking a PCR test.
  - 9) Specific conditions and requirements may apply as determined by or on behalf the Ministry of Health of the Government of Curaçao to include but not limited to Quarantine requirements & Monitoring and a COVID-19 test at the cost of the person/traveler.
  - 10) The Immigration Authority and the Department of Health of the Government of Curaçao will be performing their required screening and questioning of all arriving passengers.
  - 11) There are **No restrictions for Cargo Only Operations.**
  - 12) All passengers and flight crew members shall adhere to the requirements and guidelines of the Airport Authority to include hygiene requirements, wearing a facemask and social distancing.

The Government of Curaçao extends its sincerest apologies to all passengers and stakeholders for any inconvenience caused by these measures. This unprecedented situation warrants a quick and decisive response to safeguard the health and well-being of our population and to prevent the further spread of the COVID-19 virus in Curaçao. This is a very fluid situation and updates to this directive will be published as often as deemed necessary.
